

Deed of Conveyance: William Hoogland and Rachel his wife, to David Cumming  
New Jersey Colonial Deeds, Book A-K pp.601-604.

William Hoogland to Davide Cumming  
Recorded August 16, 1782

This Indenture made the Eleventh Day of June in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven Hundred seventy seven, Between William Hoogland of the Township of Amwell in the County of Hunterdon & Western division of the Province or State of New Jersey, Yeo'n [Yeoman] and Rachel his Wife of the one part and David Cumming Jun'r of the City of Philadelphia, coppersmith of the other Part. Whereas William Biddle late of Mount Hope in the County of Burlington in his lifetime stood sayed(?) amongst divers other things of \*\*\*? certain Tract of Land lying in the Township of Amwell afores'd, Containing one thousand six hundred and sixty five acres besides the usual allowance for Highways which to this William Biddle was there laid out and surveyed in Right of Land belonging to the third dividend of two fourths of a Propriety of Land in this(?) Western division by him purchased of Thomas Helmsley & George Hutchinson & is part of \*\*\*? propriety by this P. Helmsley & Hutchinson in partnership with others purchased of Edward Billing and Trustees as by the several Deeds of the Purchase thereof

NOTES:

- “Mount Hope in the County of Burlington” - believed to refer to a plantation by that name, belonging to William Biddle's father or grandfather, located on an island in the Delaware River.
